In Proverbs 29:18 we read 'Where there is no vision, the people perish.'

At Springhead Congregational Church, we have been blessed over the years by ministers who have painted a picture of a new vision for the church, and a people who have helped birth those visions and dreams into reality. Whether that be Donald and Pat Openshaw who, faced with a crumbling old church building had the vision to move to a new sanctuary which quickly doubled in size to accommodate what God was doing, to Liz Dean, who building on their legacy, had the boldness and freshness of vision to start new projects and initiatives, the legacy of which still continue today.

We as a congregation realise that God is never static, and a little like the character of Aslan in CS Lewis' The Narnia Chronicles 'is always on the move'. We see that in the story of The Israelites in the book of Exodus, God did not just lead them out of captivity, but over their epic journey through the desert he gave them fresh understanding, and led them on into the promised land. This notion of journey from the safe to the new, is further illustrated in the call, life and ministry of the disciples in The New Testament. Ordinary people who leave everything they knew behind to follow him and, within three short years, see their leader crucified and then resurrected, and who before being resurrected to heaven gives them a commission and a mission. So, what could God's plan for us as a people be?

Whilst lockdown posed many challenges for churches, a situation we were not immune from ourselves, we saw that God was blessing us with finances, thanks to peoples' generous donations, government furlough support and additional government grants. When lockdowns eased and restrictions lifted, we were faced with the question with what does God want us to do with the blessings we have received. It would have been easy to say 'let's save it for a rainy day' or to see the reserves depleted over a number of years on covering the cost of the gas and electric bills. The more difficult thing, the more challenging thing, and the more faith filled thing to do would be to take another bold step into the unknown and dream a new vision of what God was doing for such a time as this.

In January, deacons approved the decision to set up a small future vision group to scope what might be possible and what might able to be achieved. Once the group met, two priorities were quickly established - property and people. How do we make the church 2022+ fit for purpose? And what do we see as the mission of the church to reach outside the walls to the wider community? Early on, it was identified that we should work with a local interior designer Susie Bambridge (Uptopia Mix Interiors) and she quickly got onboard with the vision.

The plans were presented to the church and when endorsed, the work began in earnest in June. On July 3rd with the first phase of the work complete (the property), a service of rededication will take place, asking for God's blessing for future, and for him to inspire us together to work with him to see the life, ministry and mission of Springhead Congregational Church grow in the second phase 'the projects.' More of that to follow but for now, to God be the glory, great things he hath done, and may we have the sincerity of heart, and unity of purpose to imagine and birth the reality that greater things are yet to come in the life of the church.
