Dear Friends,

Beautiful and bright, daffodils are the birth flower of the month of March. In the Northern Hemisphere, March signifies the onset of spring, and daffodils are one of the first perennial flowers to bloom after a long, cold winter. Including hybrids, there are over 13,000 distinct daffodil varieties in existence. These blooms that remind us of sunshine and the coming summer are rich with meaning and symbolism.

As a spring flower, daffodils are symbols of rebirth and hope. They signify new life and resilience as they are strong little survivors who have weathered the winter storms.

Daffodils' cheerful bright yellow and white colours are a symbol of positivity. They are a happy flower that signifies joy, and an appreciation for being alive. Although these flowers come in other shades, their yellow and white colours are far better known.

The daffodil is the Welsh National Flower. Its flowering coincides with the first of March and St David's Day, the patron saint of Wales. The flowers' faithful blossoming year after year is equated to David's faithfulness to his people.

In England, daffodils are sometimes referred to as Lenten or Lent lilies as they bloom between Ash Wednesday and Easter.

And in China, daffodils bloom around Chinese New Year and are a symbol of good fortune, good luck and prosperity. If these flowers bloom exactly on Chinese New Year, they mean good luck for the whole year ahead.

The famous poet, William Wordsworth pays homage to fields of these happy flowers in his 1804 poem 'I Wandered Lonely as a Cloud' and more recently, cancer organisations around the world have used the daffodil as a symbol of hope for all people affected by cancer. In this context, they symbolise hope for a cure and also a sort of rebirth.

Lent gives us an opportunity to look to the past but also to look forward and think about the future. During Jesus' ministry he often recalled the past, but he gave us reassurance and hope to help us look forward into the future whatever we are facing.

So, as we journey through Lent and towards Easter, may we once again follow Jesus and listen to what he might reveal to us about what our future might have in store.

Each year we journey through Lent in the hope of celebrating the coming Easter season with the joy and the new life that it symbolises.
